The area adjacent to a popular dog beach at the San Diego River Mouth consists of a small but critical sand dune and salt marsh habitat. In a collaborative effort to restore the area two nonprofit groups, Project Pacific and Aquatic Adventures, with the help of the San Diego Park and Recreation Department and hundreds of volunteers worked to remove invasive plants, install interpretive signs, and reduce trails. The focus of the restoration included balancing the needs of the many visitors to the area with protecting and conserving the sensitive ecosystem.
