- 3) Birds on the beach! Ranger Brad Barker will talk about shorebirds at Doheny State Beach and how they use the park habitat.
- 4) Volunteer Grunion Greeters are back on California beaches to assess the grunion population. Senior Program Officer Melissa Studer will describe what the volunteers do. Project Director Karen Martin and students will demonstrate how to find grunion eggs incubating in the sand, how field workers can avoid disturbing them, and how to hatch grunion eggs when they are ready.
- 5) <u>12 noon– 1:00 p</u> Round table discussion: open topics and issues of concern. A picnic lunch is provided.
